

Baycrest has been named a Best Practice Spotlight Organization by the Registered Nurses Association of Ontario (RNAO), one of only 60 organizations around the world to achieve this status. We were recognized for implementing six RNAO Best Practice Guidelines that included:

- 1. Prevention of Falls and Fall Injuries in the Older Adult
- 2. Screening for Delirium, **Dementia and Depression** in Older Adults
- 3. Caregiving Strategies for Older Adults with Delirium, Dementia and Depression

- 4. Promoting Continence **Using Prompted Voiding**
- 5. Assessment and Management of Stage I-4 Pressure Ulcers
- 6. Assessment and Management of Pain

DID YOU KNOW Baycrest ranks among the best long-term care homes

in North America in the Seniors Quality Leap **Initiative's Quality Composite index?** The Canadian Institute for Health Information (CIHI) reported on the 2013-14 performance of more than 1,000 Canadian long-term care homes, and found Baycrest was better than the average for most indicators including:

- 1. Falls in the last 30 days
- 2. Potentially Inappropriate Use of Antipsychotics in Long-Term Care
- 3. Restraint Use in Long-Term Care
- 4. Worsened Physical Functioning in Long-Term Care
- 5. Worsened Depressive Mood in Long-Term Care
- 6. Experiencing Worsened Pain in Long-Term Care

The Seniors Quality Leap Initiative (SQLI), a consortium of 12 high-performing longterm care organizations across North America, aggregates quarterly quality performance data that consistently identifies Baycrest as a top performer in areas that include the proportion of residents:

- 1. Who fell
- 2. Whose mood worsened
- 3 Whose mid-loss Activities of Daily Living worsened
- 4. Whose bladder continence worsened
- 5. Whose pain worsened

- 6. Who have Stage 2-4 pressure ulcers
- 7. Who are physically restrained
- 8. Whose behaviour worsened
- 9. Who use a catheter
